
Dear Mr. Guarrera,



all of the state of Alaska north of latitude 63°

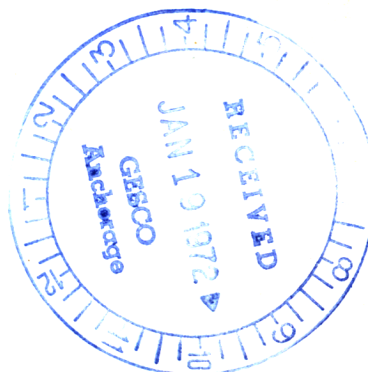

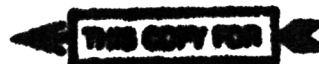
