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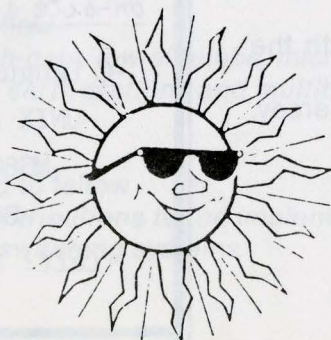

DR. BRUNO WEINSCHER WILL SPEAK AT IEEE
SPONSOR'S DAY BANQUET

Region 4 and the Chicago Section will be hosting IEEE Sponsor's Day at MIDCON 87. This all day IEEE event will occur Tuesday, September 15, 1987. The IEEE Sponsors of MIDCON are Region 4, Chicago Section, Region 5, and the Dallas Section. The day will begin with a Region 4 workshop and a Chicago Section meeting in the afternoon and will conclude with an evening banquet followed by guest speaker, Dr. Bruno Weinschel, past IEEE president, speaking on "U.S. Competitiveness." A Region 4 student officer workshop will also be held on Wednesday morning.

The evening banquet is an opportunity for region and section IEEE members and the Electronic Industry to meet dignitaries from the IEEE national office. Tickets for this event are available through the Chicago Section.

Dr. Weinschel was born in 1919 in Stuttgart, Germany, received a BA in Physics and a DR in Engineering at Technische Hochschule, Stuttgart and Munich. He also has a honorary DR in Science at Capitol Institute of Technology and holds a professional engineer's license in Washington and the State of Maryland. Dr Weinschel was a recipient of the 1985 William A. Wildhack award from the National Conference of Standards Laboratories for contributions to the field of Metrology. He is the author and co-author of 52 journal articles, inventor and co-inventor of 20 patents, and a reviewer for several journals. Dr. Weinschel has served on the IEEE Board of Directors and numerous committees.

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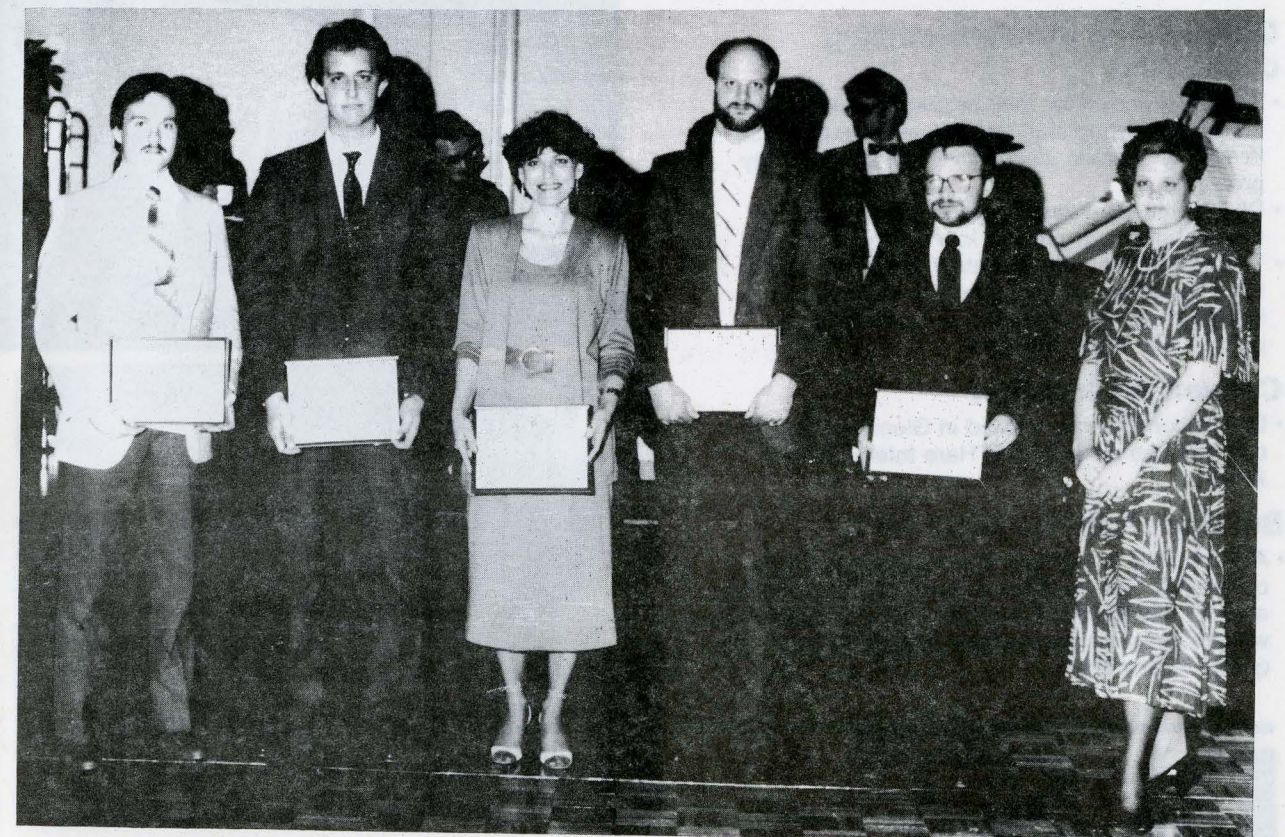

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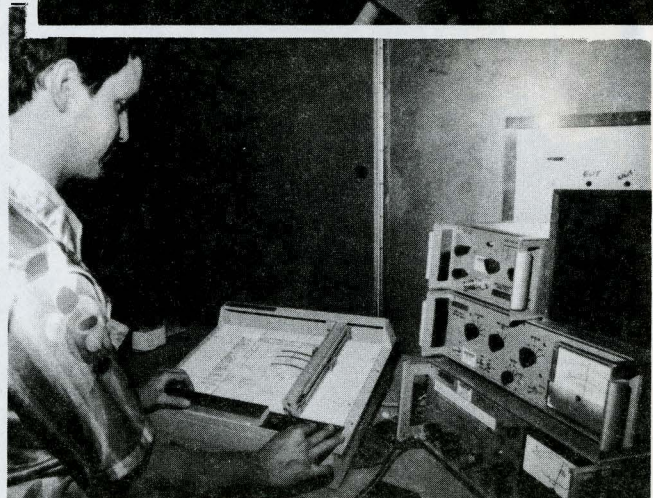
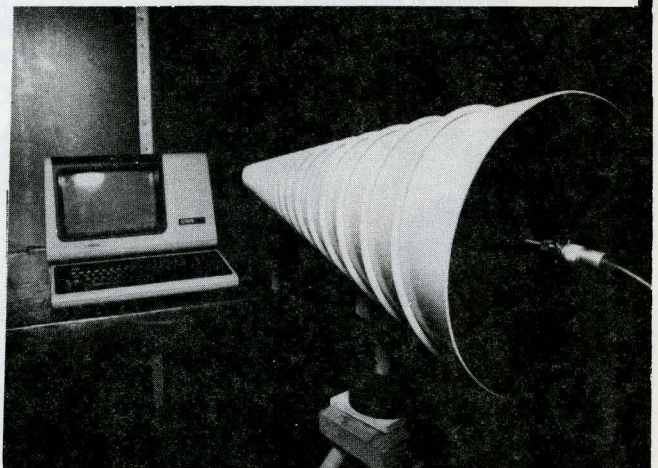
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
