I note from the Minutes of the Long Island Executive Committee, September 29, 1971, that your Section is considering an unemployment insurance plan, and that specific studies have been assigned to members of your Executive Committee.

In contributing to your study of this plan, I am attaching a copy of IEEE Policy Statement 29 approved by the Board of Directors last August and published in the October, 1971 issue of "Electrical Engineering".

11. Unemployment Insurance Plan

J. Snyder described the tentative characteristics of a Section sponsored, private insurance plan. These included a six month waiting period, automatic enrollment in basic medical and major medical plans, with other fringes possible. Membership would be open to all engineering and scientific personnel on Long Island.

Comments were made that the embellishments detract from main objective of plan - unemployment aid. Rather these features should be provided for in charter but not in initial set-up.

Early transfer of operating plan to National was recommended to spread base. Proposed that start up costs (approximately \$3,000) be covered by Long Island Section, half of which would be returned from operating revenue.

An alternative proposal requesting further study with specific technical advice (Accountants, Actuaries, Attorneys) be conducted before appropriating any funds. Butash to contact independent insurance plan, Maune to discuss with an Actuary.

REPORT OF ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH LONG ISLAND REQUEST FOR SECTION STATUS

1. McRae Committee

In connection with discussions regarding section status for Long Island (Chairman, H. E. Webber) in 1951, Dr. J. H. Mulligan, then Chairman of the New York Section, appointed a committee with Dr. J. W. McRae as chairman to consider the organization of the I.R.E. membership in the New York area. This committee reached a general conclusion that the present subsections of New York should become sections and that a regional mechanism be set up to coordinate activities of the nature of lecture series, symposia, etc., within the whole New York area.

2. Ad Hoc New York Area Organization Committee

This committee was established as a direct consequence of a recommendation of the McRae Committee. It was comprised of the present and past Region 2 directors, the chairmen of the New York Section and Subsections, and the secretary of the New York Section. Its purpose was to study the McRae Committee report and to make final recommendations.

3. Actions Taken in Connection with Long Island Request for Section Status

Several meetings of the Ad Hoc New York Area Organization Committee were held, the outcome of which was that the
Long Island Subsection was asked to prepare a proposal by which
it could attain section status. During the period of these
discussions, the membership of the Long Island Subsection was
kept informed of the activities by articles in the publication
"The Pulse of Long Island". These were printed in the September
and October 1952 issues. (A copy of each publication referred
to in this report is attached.)

The Long Island Subsection worked up a proposal by which it could become a section. This was presented to the Subsection membership in the February 1953 issue of "The Pulse".

This plan was also presented to the Ad Hoc New York Area Organization Committee and the Executive Committee of the New York Section, and was discussed at meetings held on February 4, 1953. The Ad Hoc Committee adopted the following motions in connection with this proposal:

- 1. The Long Island general plan for disaffiliation be endorsed by the New York Section.
- 2. The New York Section invite Long Island to attend its Executive Committee meetings as an ex-officio member in order to coordinate activities.
- 3. The membership of the proposed Long Island Section be comprised of members with mailing addresses in Queens, Nassau, and Suffolk.
- 4. The same consideration be given to other sub-sections desiring to disaffiliate.
- 5. The Ad Hoc Committee is discharged."

These motions were reported to the Executive Committee of the New York Section which discussed them, and adopted the following motion:

The New York Executive Committee has reviewed items I through 4 of the Ad Hoc report and favors its adoption as to Long Island. Since Long Island has requested that a poll be taken of its membership, the New York Executive Committee recommends that the polling be handled by Long Island. If the polling results in a petition, the New York Executive Committee will favor it."

These results were reported to the Long Island membership in the March 1953 issue of "The Pulse", and the Long Island Executive Committee authorized the polling of the membership in regard to section status.

4. Endorsement by Regional Committee (Region 2)

At a meeting of the Regional Committee (Region 2) held on March 23, 1953, the matter of section status for Long Island was discussed. The following motion was unanimously adopted by this committee: "Resolved: That the Region #2 Committee looks with favor on the plans of orderly change of subsections to full section status as now being carried out in the New York Section."

5. Poll of Long Island Membership

A ballot, a copy of which is enclosed, was mailed to the Long Island membership. This document presented the plan to the members, as finally determined by the actions of the Ad Hoc New York Area Organization Committee and the New York Executive Committee. Three questions were asked of the membership on the ballot, and a petition was included, to be signed by those favorable to the plan for section status.

REPORT TO MEMBERSHIP OF LONG ISLAND SUBSECTION OF I.R.E. ON SECTION STATUS

At recent meetings of the Ad Hoc New York Area Organization Committee and the New York Section Executive Committee, the plan for section status for Long Island (as presented to you in the February 1953 issue of "The Pulso") was considered. The following actions were taken by the Ad Hoc New York Organization Committee and approved by the New York Section Executive Committee:

1) It recommended that the Long Island plan for full status be endorsed by the New York Section.

2) It recommended that the New York Section invite the Long Island Section to designate a member to attend New York Section Executive Committee meetings as an expefficio member in order to coordinate activities.

3) It recommended that the membership of the proposed Long Island Section be comprised of members whose address for I.R.E. mail is in Queens, Nassau and Suffolk counties.

4) It recommended that the same consideration be given to other subsections desiring full section status.

It was the opinion of most of the members of the New York Executive Committee that the question of finances be discussed by the New York and Long Island Executive Committees after the Long Island petition for section status had been approved by the Board of Directors of the I.R.E.

The executive committee of the Long Island Subsection has approved of the actions above, and is proceeding with the plan to become a full section. A separate ballot and an addressed postage-paid envelope are included with this report. Several questions appear on the ballot and you are asked to answer these in order that the Long Island executive committee may know your wishes in the matter of full section status for Long Island. There is also civided a statement of the petition which will be submitted to the Board of Directors of the I.R.E., if, in the opinion of the Long Island Executive Committee, this is the desire of the Long Island membership as shown by the answers to the pull. You are requested, if your answers to the questions favor the fernation of the Long Island Section, to sign the petition statement, as his can be used directly as the petition and will save further mailing to the membership. Please return the ballot in the enclosing voting envelope, which should be signed on the outside in the place designated.

A resume of the plan under which Long Island would become a full section follows.

 The coordination of activities, the interchange of information such as meeting notices will be accomplished by designating a member of the Long Island executive committee for the purpose. He will be an ex-officio member of the New York Executive Committee.

2) The membership of the Long Island Section would be comprised of all members whose address for I.R.E. mell is in the Counties of Queens, Massau, and Suffolk. It should be noted here, that it is the I.R.E. MAIL ADDRESS which governs the membership, so that a member living in Queens, Nassau, or Suffolk county who works in New York has the option of membership in either the New York or Long Island Section.

3) The Long Island Section would be supported by funds from I.R.E. Head-quarters as are all sections. Also, since the New York Section has accumulated a surplus in recent years, it is expected that the New York Section will make available a reasonable fraction of this surplus to Long Island on its becoming a full section.

4) All who sign the petition for section status for Long island agree to abide by the CONSTITUTION FOR SECTIONS which is a standard constitution governing all sections of the Institute of Radio Engineers. As present members of the New York Section we are now operating under this constitution. Its salient points are:

 That the organization shall be known as the Long Island Section of the I.R.E., Inc.

That all members having I.R.E. mail addresses within the territory are automatically members of the Section.

3. The territory of the Section shall be set by the Board of Directors.

4. There shall be no Section dues.

5. The officers shall be a chairman, vice chairman, secretary, and treasurer.

6. There shall be an executive committee to manage the Section.

7. The Section shall not hold less than five regular meetings a year.

Dear Mr. Snyder:

I am writing to bring you up-to-date on the preliminary legal review of the proposal of your Section to establish an Unemployment Insurance Program. Cur lawyers tell us that, from a legal point of view, the Program cannot be operated by the Section, or by any other unit of the IEEE. It must be operated exclusively by an insurance company, adminstrator, an agent or other entity approved by the IEEE Executive Committee. This follows the selection of the Sternau Crganization as the Administrator for the IEEE Group Insurance Plans. Secondly, the lawyers point out that under no circumstances may any IEEE funds be used directly or indirectly in connection with the plan. I enclose copies of a letter dated December 17 from Mr. James R. Wiener and a copy of rider A and rider B which relate to the first and last paragraphs of the "Unemployed Loan Plan" dated December 9, 1971 which I had submitted to him.

I also understand from Mr. Sternau that it is unlikely that an insurance company will be interested in participating in such a plan and that it may be desirable to approach a bank.

In view of the above, I would appreciate your keeping me currently informed of the status of your project. As noted by Mr. Wiener in the last paragraph of his attached letter, the final version of the plan when all the subsidiary questions have been ironed out, must be reviewed by legal counsel before submission to the Executive Committee for approval.

Referring to yours of December 16th, I enclose a suggested marked-up redraft of the proposed loan plan. While such a plan, revised as per my enclosed redraft, would not be within the strict scope of I.E.E.E.'s taxexempt purposes as a "(c)(3)" organization, as is the case with respect to other insurance-type plans, I believe that the activity could be regarded as sufficiently insubstantial not to jeopardize I.E.EE's "(c)(3)" status.

As you will note, the enclosed redraft is designed to limit the direct participation of I.E.E.E. Sections to an absolute minimum: all that they would really be doing is informing their members of the availability of the plan. It is, of course, critical that this limitation be observed. It goes without saying that no I.E.E.E. funds may be made available under the loan plan.

In view of the highly sensitive nature of this type of plan, I would like to review a final version before it is given definitive approval by the I.E.E.E. Executive Committee.


