

Prof. Kennelly to Retire at Harvard

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Feb. 12.—Arthur Edwin Kennelly, for the past twenty-eight years Professor of Electrical Engineering at Harvard University and one-time principal electrical assistant to Thomas A. Edison, will retire at the close of the present academic year and assume the rank of professor at Harvard. In the war he served with the A. E. F. in England and France in 1917-18. In 1921 he was the first exchange professor to the universities of France in "engineering and applied sciences" from seven American cooperating universities.
