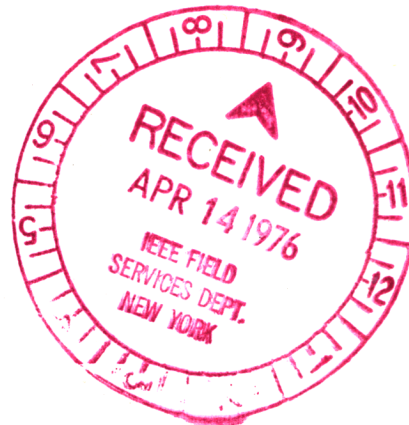

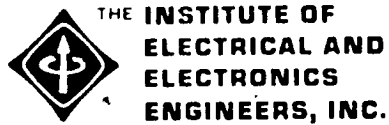

Dear Luis:

Attached is correspondence dated February 27, 1976, recently received from Orest Meykar, on the establishment of the Honduras Subsection of the Central America Section. Mr. Meykar reports that activity has been started in Honduras and also that our office has sufficient information to process the petition to establish the Honduras Subsection. The following is my understanding in the current status of the petition to form this Subsection:

1. Past Director J. R. Costa de Lacerda agreed to authorize the establishment of the Honduras Subsection upon receipt of a petition signed by at least 15 IEEE members, above Student grade, five less than required by the IEEE Bylaws.
2. A copy of a petition to establish the Subsection was submitted to Director Lacerda on September 11, 1975 with eleven signatures and assurance that at least four applications for membership would be forthcoming shortly. As of this writing we have no record of the applications being received, or names of applicants.
3. Our records show that as of 12/31/75 there were 20 active members in Honduras. The names of these members were included on the annual roster of the Central America Section which was sent to the Section Secretary, Fernando Cuevas, in January.
4. Although the officers of the proposed Subsection have been reported (attached) and apparently meeting activity has begun, we are still unable to take any further action on the formal establishment of the Subsection until a properly completed petition with at least 15 signatures of active IEEE members, above Student grade, is received, approved by you, and endorsed by the Regional Activities Board.

Dear Alec:

Please forgive for my space saving letters. US airmail is 25 cents per half ounce, and even the weight of a stamp causes a problem. Please read the letter from Miss Emily Sirjane on the other side. As was suggested to me by the Honduras organizers and your secretary, I was to follow up on the progress of charter application by the Honduras subsection. This is the situation as of a few days ago. Please remember that I am acting only as a friend and an occasional expeditor or advisor, not authorized by you or any other IEEE authority. My opinions on this letter are as follows: (in numerical sequence)

1. The Headquarters has all the information it needs now on Honduras. If Mr. Asdal has the petition, I assume he will clear it with Luis Jimenez, the new Region 9 Director, and will forward it to RAB (Regional Activities Board) for final action. But please remember this- THE HONDURAS SUBSECTION ACTIVITY HAS BEEN STARTED. As in Catholic religion, holy water does not make you a good man, but good works do. Therefore, the subsection must continue to meet and to institute progressive programs, field tours, seminars, student chapters, etc. That is what makes an organization an active one, NOT AN OFFICIAL CHARTER FROM IEEE. Anybody in Honduras had and still has the right to meet and to do anything that IEEE encourages, and permission from the IEEE Headquarters is not required. They have had full encouragement from the Centroamerica Section, for several years. I recommend that they keep in touch with you, Costa Rica subsection and Guatemala people-and we in El Salvador will do anything we can to help them. I will be glad to come as often as they wish and help them in every way. I will write to Eric soon.
 2. Dr. Cosenza, Rodrigo Orozco and you should be happy that the final press release I have been typing in 3 countries several times has been received by the SPECTRUM people and will be in print soon, including the new dates for Convention in Costa Rica, 1-3 July. The February SPECTRUM calendar has it as 28-31 July. Don't worry, everybody in USA, Canada and Mexico has heard from me about the change and several persons are ready to send their paper.
 3. We in Central America should begin to promote more members to Senior Members, and also nominate some Fellows. We have excellent talent in our five countries and it should be recognized. When I become a resident of Central America (in San Salvador) in June, I would like to help you and the next Centroamerica Section headquarters with this important work-and also to help with the awards and honors. I also believe that there should be a candidate for President of IEEE from Region 9, but he must be a man who can obtain a majority vote. To be nominated he must have 1% of total voting members on his petition. However, there is a better way- we must work toward making the Directors of Region 7, 8, 9 and 10 (foreign regions) as full Vice-Presidents of IEEE. That will make the IEEE a more global organization, as it should be. Right now, because of economic conditions in the USA, the professional needs of USA members have a greater importance to the Board of Directors of IEEE, because there are more members and there are special membership dues for IEEE activities within USA.

I understand that Mr. Robert K. Asdal, newly-designated Manager of Field Services, who is now in South America, may bring this petition to IEEE on his return to the office.
2. The SPECTRUM staff reports that they have received notification of the change in date of the Centroamerican Convention and this change will appear in the next issue of SPECTRUM.
3. Attached is copy of IEEE Bylaw 315.5 which spells out the procedure for nomination petitions for the IEEE President and Executive Vice President. The total voting members on record as of December 31, 1975 was 144,760.

I hope you had a nice visit in Central America and I can imagine you helped out a lot in Honduras with their new subsection.

Congratulations on the honor that the Washington Section has bestowed upon you.

I imagine you must have a pretty good idea of what happened to our country on February the 4th. The loss of life has been great and the area affected very large. The help of other countries, especially the U.S. has been plentiful. Considering everything, the majority of the people of Guatemala City came out of it with very little damage, not so the people of several villages and towns which no longer exist.


Our subsection activities will be held at a standstill until the month of April, as right now is not the proper time to be holding public assemblies considering that up to this date since the 4th, there have been over 1000 aftershocks, some so small that they can not be felt, but so far there are about four to six jolts daily that make everybody talk about it.

Please advise when you arrive in El Salvador so we can get in touch.

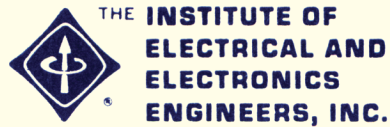

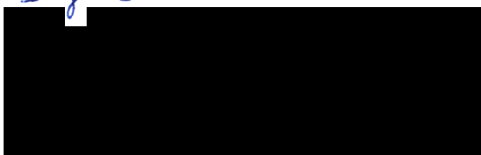
These samples are not necessarily the last issues, once they will be used for promotion, demonstration among the engineers.
